Under Executive Order (EO) 11988 and EO 11990, FEMA is required to consider alternatives, and to provide a public notice of any proposed actions in or affecting floodplains or wetlands. EO 12898 also requires FEMA to provide the opportunity for public participation in the planning process and to consider potential impacts to minority and low-income populations. This notice may also fulfill requirements under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA).

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state, and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions.

Special Flood Hazard Area Zone:

This project is for the replacement of a water supply line in the Town of Forest City. The project is located within a Floodway. Confirmation of location in a Floodway was determined by the Rutherford County Effective Flood Insurance Rate Map, Panel Number: 3710155800J, dated 7/2/2008. The proposed work conforms to all applicable State of North Carolina and local floodplain regulations. There is a potential for the facility to be impacted by future flooding events due to its location within the Floodway. The proposed work will not take place in designated wetlands, per the United States Fish and Wildlife Service National Wetlands Inventory.

Proposed Work and Purpose:

The Town of Forest City plans to permanently repair a water supply line by removing and replacing damaged sections of 12-inch ductile iron pipe, burying 7 feet below the stream bed in a 3-foot wide trench. The trench will then be backfilled with sand and other natural material and the embankment armored with rip rap, seeded, and planted with live vegetation.

Project Alternatives:

Alternative #1 (No Action): The 'no action' alternative would ultimately result in a negative impact on The Town of Forest City. The water line supplies clean water to the community which is essential for human health and safety.

Alternative #2 (Repair in-kind): The proposed action preserves the natural and beneficial values of the floodplain by facilitating open space use.
